





Bolden

Little is known about the life of musician Buddy Bolden:

He was born on September 6, 1877.

At the age of 30, he was committed to an asylum where he died in 1931.

His only known recording has never been found.

He invented Jazz.

With little biographical information and no found recordings of his music, the film's narrative composes fragmented memories of his past, against the political and social context in which his revolutionary music was conceived. The birth of jazz was the birth of American popular culture influencing everything that followed in its wake from Louis Armstrong to Jimi Hendrix, The Rolling Stones, The Fugees and Dr. Dre, Bolden is where it all began.

Starring Gary Carr as Bolden, and with original music written, arranged and performed by Wynton Marsalis, BOLDEN invites you to experience the longlost world of New Orleans in the early 1900s - a world fueled by passion, greed and musical genius. JAZZ ON THE BEACH

JOTB archived programs are broadcast on WUCF-FM Orlando 89.9 on Saturdays from 12-3 p.m.

I hope you'll forgive me for using what you might call an overused phrase. However, "to come full circle" was so appropriate that I used it anyway! Here's the story:

Almost 50 years ago, I began producing the first of many jazz concerts and festivals, held primarily in Cocoa Beach. The musicians involved in these shows graciously volunteered their talents to benefit a local singing group, The Junior Messengers. They were a young, multi-racial group, organized by my wife Lorraine, Sophie Melbourne and Sister Domitilla (from St. Mary's Church in Rockledge) - averaging 50 kids from 6 to 18 years old. Proceeds from these benefits provided music lessons, scholarships and instruments for the youngsters, giving them a positive thing to do. The program, with its message of love and brotherhood, was successful and applauded by parents, musicians, club owners, and the kids themselves.

The concerts continued with performances in various black and white churches, radio and TV shows and other social service functions. The resulting benefits were shared by The Junior Messengers and the community food bank. This was, I believe, the first time that jazz had been used for local fundraising. As a lover of jazz, I was delighted!

OK! So how do we "come full circle? Here it is: As we always knew, some of these Junior Messengers had budding musical talent, and the experiences they had in those early concerts helped shape them. We know that members like <u>Calvin McCoy</u>, <u>Pres Jordan</u>, <u>Jeff</u>, John and <u>Ken Simpson</u>, Laron Washington, and <u>Oliver W. Wells</u> are doing well in their professional musical endeavors. Recently, another young star from 50 years ago, sang the praises of a man who's been called the Father of Jazz! Yes, our great friend (and now "Senior" Messenger) <u>LeRoy Darby</u> is the co-director and has a leading role in the play *Louis Armstrong's Wonderful*

World, undoubtedly with its own message of love and brotherhood.

The show opened on Friday, June 28th with additional performances on Saturday, June 29th and Sunday, June 30th, 2019. All concerts were held at the Cocoa Village Playhouse. If you were able to attend, you can surely understand my enthusiasm.
